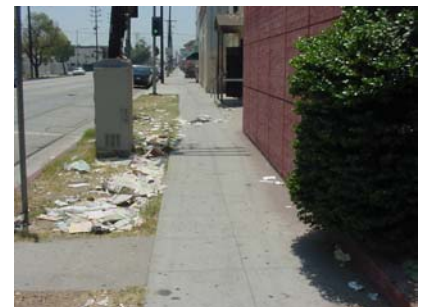
Illegal dumping continues to be one of the hot topics of conversation in the news, and in the communities we live and work. The SUID doesn't view this lightly as presumed by many.

SUID is the enforcement agency within the Bureau of Street Services that addresses any violations involving illegal dumping. Currently, the law under the L.A.M.C. 66.25, states: "**Illegal Dumping**" is punishable by either a \$1000.00 fine or 6 months in jail, if caught and prosecuted.

The Neighborhood Prosecution Teams, the L.A.P.D. and the Neighborhood Councils (NCs) are assisting SUID to address these issues involving illegal dumping. From

December 2001 – June 2002 over fifteen administrative hearings were conducted involving illegal dumping. One individual was arrested with a criminal filing pending.

The new surveillance signs obtained by SUID have been a big deterrent against much of the criminal activity. However, illegal dumping continues to a wide spread problem. The Lot Cleaning Division works with SUID by removing all trash and debris, which is deposited onto public property. SUID will continue to lead the enforcement and address reported requests.
